

Medium Red Clover



The most widely grown Red Clover, Medium ranks next to alfalfa in hay value. It is an excellent soil fertility builder. Two hay cuttings can usually be taken per year season.

- **Grown most extensively in the Northeastern and North Central states and as far south as Tennessee and Virginia**
- **An important crop in the irrigated areas of the Western states, especially Idaho, Washington and Oregon**
- **Usually considered a biennial and is well suited for short rotations**
- **Generally used for pasture or hay, as well as a soil improvement crop**

Medium Red Clover does best on fairly heavy, well-drained fertile soils, but it will tolerate acidic soils better than alfalfa. It requires more moisture than alfalfa and is not as winter hardy. Medium Red Clover will generally not yield as much as alfalfa where alfalfa is adapted.
